To and from the airport

An eco-friendly and cheap way to travel from Barcelona's airport to downtown is by bus. The "Aerobus" leaves from Terminal 1 and Terminal 2 every 5' and it costs € 5,90 (one way) and € 10,20 (round trip). It takes about 35' from the airport to Plaza Catalunya. Public transportation

Barcelona has an extended and efficient public transport network, have a look at this link: <http://bit.ly/1wZEF7P>
Barcelona has an integrated fare system enabling passengers to obtain a free transfer from one means of public transport to another within a period of 1 hour and 15 minutes. There are different types of travel cards and transport passes in Barcelona that are valid throughout the public transport network (metro, buses, tram and suburban rail). A single ticket costs € 2,15, this is an individual non-integrated ticket, so it's valid only for a single journey. If you are staying different days in the city consider buying:

- a T-10 card which is valid for 10 journeys and can be shared among more than one person. The T-10 card costs € 9,95),
- or day passes available for 2, 3, 4 and 5 days. You'll find the tariffs and conditions here: <http://www.tmb.cat/en/barcelona-travel-card>

If you need a taxi, consider the option to book one of the hybrid taxis available in the city, you'll contribute to a better air quality in the city and a more efficient mobility of Barcelona.
